2. The Blamer will say such things as it's your fault, not mines etc.





3. The Justifier will say such things as well I don't have a good enough education so that is why I don't get ahead, I would have made it if I had more time, oh I really didn't want to be rich anyway or well everyone else was or is doing it.
4. The Quitter will say such things as I told you that it would never work, this is too hard and it's not worth it, I am going to do something else easier, why am I doing this? I don't need this hassle.
5. The Denier Rich Dad often called this person the cat in the litter box, which means this person tends to bury his or her mistakes, no, there is nothing wrong, things are fine, mistakes? What mistakes or don't worry things will work out.

Lastly Mr. Kiyosaki goes on to say when you make a mistake, one or more of these characters will take over your mind and body.

To learn and gain wisdom from priceless mistakes, you have to let the responsible you take control of your thinking.

If a person says, what I learned is that I'll never do this again, he or she probably has not learned much, besides people who avoid mistakes or waste mistakes never see the other side of the coin.
